Biography

Stephen Truax is an artist, writer, and art dealer in New York, where he founded Truax Art Advisory in 2022. His work has been exhibited at The FLAG Art Foundation (New York), the Long Island Museum (Stony Brook), and Ochi Gallery (Ketchum), and discussed in *The New York Times, ARTFORUM, Paper, ArtPulse*, and *Hyperallergic*. His work is in the public collection of the Tang Teaching Museum at Skidmore College (Saratoga Springs).

Stephen was a collaborator on *Living Histories: Queer Views and Old Masters* (2021-2022) at The Frick Collection (New York), and a contributing editor of the <u>exhibition catalog</u> with Xavier F. Salomon and Aimee Ng (2023).
