# **Stephen Truax**

### **Biography**

Stephen Truax is an art dealer, artist, and writer in New York, where he founded Truax Art Advisory in 2022. He was a collaborator on *Living Histories: Queer Views and Old Masters* (2021-2022), at The Frick Collection, New York, and a contributing editor of the exhibition catalog with Xavier F. Salomon and Aimee Ng (2023). He curated two exhibitions on Queer art: *Any distance between us* (2021-2022), at RISD Museum in Providence with Dominic Molon, and *Intimacy* (2018) at Yossi Milo Gallery in New York. His essay, "Why Young Queer Artists Are Trading Anguish for Joy," was commissioned by *Artsy* in 2017. Truax's work has been exhibited at The FLAG Art Foundation (New York), Ochi Gallery (Ketchum), and Klaus von Nichtssagend (New York). His work has been discussed in *The New York Times*, *Paper* magazine, *ArtPulse* magazine, and *Hyperallergic*.
